#### SUPREME COURT DECISION - RIGHT TO STRIKE

As everyone knows, the Supreme Court of Canada has confirmed that the right to strike is constitutionally protected. This decision has, of course, significance for MacEwan University, as well as other Alberta post-secondary institutions, which are currently subject to binding arbitration. The Government of Alberta has requested that our institution respond to two issues, one of how to proceed with transitioning away from binding arbitration and the other to determine what constitutes an essential service in the eventuality of a strike. This requires broad consultation, and, I believe, input has also been requested from the MacEwan University Faculty Association, the MacEwan University Staff Association, and the Student Association of MacEwan University. These two issues have far reaching significance for the institution,

**Description:** This volume addresses whether social media use is more common among liberal or conservative citizens, candidates, and organizations; the level of negativity in social media discourse and the impact on attitudes; the existence of echo chambers of like-minded individuals and groups; the extent and nature of interactivity in social media; and whether social media will reinforce participation inequalities. In sum, the studies suggest that negativity and interactivity on social media are limited and mixed support for echo chambers. While social media mobilizes citizens, these citizens are those who already pre-disposed to engage in civic and political life.
