# EXPOSING UVDERGRADUTIE RESEARGH IN INSTITUTIONAL REPOSITORIES

Archiving exemplary works by undergraduate students in institutional repositories (IRs) can have a number of benefits:

- Providing permanent, searchable access to works for inclusion in CVs \& graduate school applications.
- Promoting research opportunities.
- Exposing students to open access self-archiving early in their academic careers.

To date, however, Canadian IR services engaged in such practices is low.


## RECOMMENDATIONS

Provide clear deposit guidelines for undergraduate work.

Teach undergraduates about opportunities to share work.

Showcase student work in IRs on university websites.

Promote student-focused repository services to faculty.

Mandate IR deposit for undergraduate honours theses.
