

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Deposit Student Work

Works by MacEwan University students are welcome with a faculty member's approval.

Suitable works include exceptional and unique efforts such as:

- · Undergraduate theses, captone projects, research reports, & independant studies
- Conference poster & presentation files
- · Podcasts & digital stories
- Artistic works including music recordings, design projects, creative writing, & digital copies of art pieces

Following deposit, it typically takes 2-3 weeks for a work to be posted to RO@M. Both the student and faculty member approving the posting will receive an email confirmation with a link to the work once it has been posted.

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If you wish to deposit works into RO@M, please first review the Deposit Guidelines.




Deposit Works

Step 6: Share Your Work
